Tonight we welcome our good friends from Braintree Town Football Club, can I wish their Directors, Manager, Players, Staff and Supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well, it's been an eventful last 10 days or so back in the National League, as we've played a very good Rochdale team losing a close game 2-0, played Notts Forest u/21's in the National League Cup winning 2-0, and then travelled to Cumbria to face Carlisle United in front of nearly 9,000 fans, where we led at half time, trailed late on before deservedly drawing 3-3. The good thing for me is the summer building works can now slow down and the new season can begin in earnest.

Player news:

Other than the injured Jack Payne and Joe Newton, every other player within the squad has already had good minutes and everyone has played a big part in what has been a promising start to the season performance wise.

On the recruitment front both Luke and Charlie Hunter are still working on strengthening the squad but these things do take time to get right and so we will need to be patient. That said, we have just been forced to sell Tom Whelan to AFC Fylde, although in truth we didn't want to let him go.

Disappointing though it is, Tom did have a buy out clause in his contract and Fylde were obviously told that by third parties, they activated it and we were informed on Sunday by Tom's agent that Tom wanted to discuss personal terms with Fylde which he did and subsequently accepted their terms.

There are no complaints from me as in business terms the contract is the rule book which we must all abide by and the buy out clause was about fair. It was activated by Fylde, Tom wanted to go as it was a longer deal, more money and very importantly for Tom it would possibly give him more game time. We of course wish him well, we remember last season's promotion, we forget the relegation and personally I thank him for his friendship and service.

Our squad as you know is not the biggest, as shown on the back page of our programme each and every week and that's often highlighted by visiting fans, managers and clubs as if it's a huge downside. That is not how we see it, as we believe that quality over quantity as a conscious footballing decision has always held us in good stead throughout my tenure here.

I have always believed that putting together a better quality group of players within a smaller squad system often assists the club, manager and aids him in keeping his players happy, it also often suits keeping things financially viable and has over the years often been dictated by our year on year building programmes, our facility upgrades etc, while we also factor in things like the size of our growing fanbase, season ticket sales and the level we are playing at.

Our budget policies are not for everybody and if I was Carlisle United's Chairman/Owner and had 8,000 home supporters spending up to £26 a ticket, I would of course fill my boots. But we're not that type of club so we must do what works best for us and that has meant step by step progress, long term partnerships and our future proofing stadium huilds.

As we now look to develop the club further, improve the facility further and improve the academy both on and off the field in the manner we've done for more than two decades, we must do so while not weakening ourselves at National League level and that will be my main aim this season.

We are in truth not a club that can carry, say, a squad of 25 plus players this season even if we wanted to. Our present budget means Luke would end up with a

lot of bang average players being paid a tad more money than they're possibly worth and although that is subjective, it is the only outcome I could foresee.

At times a club like ours can get vilified by some of the bigger clubs and their supporters for possibly bloodying their nose at times, competing on much lower resources or possibly because we are playing them as equals when having a much smaller support base. Anyway, for whatever reasons we are financially sound, we are successful in our own right and I do try to invest in all things local and do try to pay reasonably well.

In truth we must always be resourceful and at present we have had to adapt and come to terms with new things like having 7 subs and that means creating a slightly bigger squad, and that will affect things financially across the whole club.

Luke and the backroom staff will also now be working on how best to utilise a 7-man bench and how to best use up to five subs. The days of the starting eleven finishing the game or being used week in week out at this level is over. Full time football is now very much about athleticism, high energy, physicality, peak powers, analysis, medical departments, strength and conditioning, nutrition and the whole squad and our professional backroom staff playing their part.

That said, it's also about owners like me evolving and football clubs like ours working smart not stupid and that means understanding the transfer market, dealing with agents, knowing our budget restrictions, increasing our club partnerships, growing the clubs' commercial partners and being intelligent enough at times to work smart within the recruitment process and not become too emotional.

How Luke looks at or preempts how his teams might start a match will need to dovetail in the coming years with how he might finish games and as you can see at the levels above us and around us, it's often the players who finish games who now win or lose football matches.

We are at present trying to create a squad that ensures we have legs and goals in key areas and whether we bring people on or take people off, you do need legs and nous throughout 90 plus minutes if we are going to be successful.

We've already seen in last seasons play-offs, and in this seasons opening games, how the bench can influence things positively and our subs/finishers up at Carlisle United played a huge, huge part in securing us a point and silencing nearly 9,000 Brunton Park supporters.

In truth I felt we were great value for what was a very hard earned point and it made the journey home for the team and

our supporters that much better. On that note I would like to thank our supporters for their efforts, their voices and I'm so pleased we gave you a performance to sing about and sustain you on the long journey home.

Anyway, back to this evening's game and our visitors Braintree Town, like us theu have their own business model and if it works for them, and it clearly does, then good luck to them. They have started the season pretty well and as a club we have played them many times over the years and so know how difficult this game will be.

Let's look forward to an open, attacking game and may the best team win.



Mason TERRY

Born: 20 September 2004 Position: Goalkeeper

In between the sticks for the Iron, Mason Terry joined West Ham aged nine after being scouted from Essex Allstars. A Youth Cup winner in 2023, he signed professionally ahead of the 2023/24 season. Loan spells at Concord Rangers and Hornchurch saw him twice win Supporters' Player of the Season, keeping 17 clean sheets in 53 games for the latter. Now, this season, Terry has made the step up to the National League with Braintree Town.



Lewis WALKER

Born: 14 April 1999 Position: Forward

Up top for Braintree Town, Walker began his senior career at Ilkeston before spells with Derby County, Darlington, and QPR, where he made his professional debut in 2019. After playing in Italy with Como and Athletic Carpi, Walker returned to England with Gillingham and Woking, scoring 14 goals in 59 appearances before joining Braintree Town in 2025. The Iron frontman will certainly be eyeing the scoresheet this evening after an opening dau brace.



Fletcher HUBBARD

Born: 28 March 2006 Position: Midfield

Young prospect, Hubbard began his career with Upminster Park Rovers before joining West Ham United in 2014. After seven years, he took a scholarship with Swindon Town, making his debut in an EFL Trophy match in 2023. Following a loan at Melksham Town and release from Swindon, he joined Brightlingsea Regent, scoring 12 goals in 2024–25. In July, Hubbard signed for National League side Braintree Town after a successful trial and recently scored to seal a 2-0 win over Leicester City U21 in the National League Cup.


The deadlock was finally broken shortly after the restart when Conor Clifford's free-kick was missed by the Braintree defence, allowing Scott Doe to head in at the far post, ending the Iron's long home clean sheet record. Moments later, Howell doubled the lead in style, curling home a superb volley from the edge of the box.

Despite Braintree throwing men forward, Wood's defence stood firm, with Russell and Sam Cox making key interventions to seal an impressive away victory.

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war Braintree Town goalscoring favourites

JOHN DICK

Inside-forward John Dick gained Scotland international recognition after leaving Braintree Town. Initially with Maryhill, he netted 31 goals in 52 games for Crittall Athletic (as Braintree were then known) during his National Service in the REME at Colchester. He joined West Ham in June 1953 and was top scorer on four occasions, including their 1957-58 Second Division title triumph. Capped against England in April 1959, he moved to Brentford in September 1962 and starred in their 1962-63 Fourth Division title success. He was later Gravesend & Northfleet's player-boss, then worked for the Inner London Education Authority and died in September 2000.

IVAN GOODAY

Striker Ivan Gooday was Braintree Town's leading marksman in three successive seasons. The eldest son of former Braintree player Malcolm Gooday, he made his firstteam debut during the 1978-79 campaign and formed a lethal partnership with Chris Guy as Braintree won the Eastern Counties League title in 1983-84 and 1984-85, netting 169 goals in 362 games. He later managed Coggeshall Town to the Essex & Suffolk Border League Cup final in 2011-12 and promotion back to the Premier Division in 2012-13, then was Cressing United's manager. He was a mechanic at Campbell's, then worked for Unilever UK and still lives in Braintree.

CHRIS GUY

Striker Chris Guy holds Braintree Town's goalscoring record. Moving to Cressing Road in July 1983, he formed a deadly partnership with Ivan Gooday and was top scorer as Braintree won the Eastern Counties League title in 1983-84 and 1984-85. He starred as they reached the FA Vase fifth round in 1984-85 and 1987-88, FA Cup fourth qualifying round for the first time in 1985-86 and finished Eastern Counties League runners-up in three successive seasons. Also a key figure as Braintree won the Essex Senior Trophy in 1987 and Eastern Counties League Cup in 1988, he scored a club record 211 goals in 366 games overall before leaving in Mau 1990.

WADE FALANA

Much-travelled striker Wade Falana was Braintree Town's top scorer with 47 goals in 45 games in 1995-96. He had spells at Leytonstone & Ilford and Tooting & Mitcham before moving to Sheffield United in August 1992. Later with Doncaster Rovers, Scarborough, Chesterfield, Heybridge Swifts, Erith & Belvedere and Fisher Athletic he joined Braintree in October 1995. He was also leading marksman in 1996-97 and moved to Romford in June 1997, then played for Harlow Town, Braintree again on loan, Tonbridge Angels, Carshalton Athletic, Windsor & Eton, Bromley, AFC Wimbledon, Walton & Hersham, Dulwich Hamlet and Croydon Athletic.

GARY BENNETT

Striker Gary Bennett scored a club record 57 goals for Braintree Town in 1997-98. Signing professional for Colchester United in November 1988, he featured prominently in their 1991-92 Conference title and FA Trophy 'double' triumph and moved to Woking in July 1993. He then played for Dagenham & Redbridge before joining Braintree in December 1995 and was leading marksman in consecutive seasons. Moving to Sudbury in July 1999, he joined Chelmsford City in

February 2000 and was 'Player of the Year' prior to rejoining Sudbury in July 2001. He appeared in three FA Vase finals and later played for Witham, then coached lpswich Wanderers.

ROBBIE REINELT

Striker Robbie Reinelt was Braintree Town's leading marksman in 2000-01. A former Aldershot trainee, he moved via Wivenhoe to Gillingham in March 1993. He was swapped for Colchester United's Steve Brown in March 1995 and starred as they qualified for the Third Division play-offs in 1995-96. Moving to Brighton in February 1997, he achieved cult status by scoring the goal at Hereford United that preserved their Football League status that season. He joined Leyton Orient in August 1998, then Stevenage, St Albans City, Braintree from July 1999 until May 2002, Aldershot, Grays Athletic, Maldon Town, Ford United and Boreham Wood.

ALEX REVELL

Striker Alex Revell was Braintree Town's top scorer in two consecutive seasons. Starting at Cambridge United, he joined Braintree in October 2004 and was a key figure as they reached the Isthmian League Premier Division play-offs in 2004-05, then won the title in 2005-06, netting 38 goals in 68 games before moving to Brighton in July 2006. Joining Southend United in January 2008, he helped reach the League One play-offs that season, moving via Leyton Orient to Rotherham in August 2011. He starred as they won promotion in two consecutive seasons, then played for Cardiff City, MK Dons, Northampton and Stevenage, becoming coach, then manager.

SEAN MARKS

Striker Sean Marks was leading marksman with 25 goals in Braintree Town's 2010-11 Conference South title triumph. 'Marksy' progressed through the ranks at Heybridge Swifts and helped qualify for the Isthmian League Premier Division play-offs in 2005-06. He joined Braintree in July 2008, starring as they reached the FA Cup first round proper in four successive seasons and Conference National play-offs in 2015-16. Reunited with Alan Devonshire at Maidenhead United in May 2016, he helped win the Conference South title in 2016-17. He joined AFC Hornchurch

in July 2018, then played for AFC Sudbury before hanging up his boots in May 2021.

MICHAEL CHEEK

England Semi-Pro international striker Michael Cheek was top scorer as Braintree Town qualified for the Conference National play-offs in 2015-16. Initially with Stanway Rovers, he played for Marks Tey and Stanway again before joining Heybridge in May 2012. He moved to Chelmsford City in January 2014 and was leading marksman in 2014-15. Joining Braintree in May 2015, he netted 34 goals in 84 games, moving to Dagenham & Redbridge in June 2017. He had a season with Ebbsfleet United prior to joining Bromley in May 2019, scoring their winner in the 2022 FA Trophy final and twice in their 2024 Conference National play-off final success.

AARON BLAIR

Striker Aaron Blair was leading marksman as Braintree Town regained Conference National status in 2023-24. A former Dagenham & Redbridge trainee, he was loaned to Brightlingsea Regent, then Braintree, during the 2022-23 campaign. Impressing with five goals in a seven-match spell, he rejoined Braintree on a permanent basis in October 2023. He scored in both the Conference South play-off semi-final and final triumphs that season, netting 31 goals in 91 games overall for the Iron. Moving to Maidstone United in June 2024, he

was top scorer as they

reached the Conference South play-off final in 2024-25 and joined Eastleigh in June 2025.
