Tonight we welcome Southend United to the Mangata Developments Stadium Meadow Park, can I wish their Directors, Manager, Players, Staff and Supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well it's fair to say we are possibly surprising a lot of clubs within this league with our start and in truth we're possibly surprising ourselves. I wrote in my last programme notes on some of the reasons why I think we have started so strongly and for me now is not the time to over-analyse things, now Is the time to go with it and enjoy this moment in time for all it's worth.

I've been at the club for so many years, and in that we've time built many good platforms, many good environments and many successful teams, along with my staff and my managers and though it's still very early days in this new rebuild, it is perhaps true that no matter what you build off the park your club is only judged by your dressing room, recruitment, performances and results.

If the above is true......then I'm pleased to say we have almost completed three sides of our stadium and the home fan's bar and facilities to a high standard. As such, we can now turn our attention to finally building the away stand and facilities at the

South end (forgive the pun) of the Stadium.

If we can achieve that and still stay financially strong then I've done my job as we will have a stadium that's fully EFL compliant, a budget to hopefully create another successful period for the football club and I feel with continued good recruitment we can build another competitive dressing room and create a very positive environment. If we do that, then I'm hopeful our future is bright.

When you are part of a small club like ours, you must understand who you are when you meet clubs as big as Southend United. It's no good going into any game with an inferiority complex or worrying about any clubs' budget, its squad size or in truth its history. It's more important for a club like ours to go into the game with an excitement to perform in front of bigger than normal crowds and enjoy the enormous away following that clubs like Southend United bring.

This evening's game is an exciting one because of the amazing away support

Southend United enjoy. Their fans make every away match an occasion and in truth it's why smaller clubs like us look forward so much to a Southend United visit and these are among the first games we look for when the fixtures are announced.

I'm also very good friends with John Still who heads up Southend's recruitment team and I speak with him most weeks. John is someone who I've often gone to for advice throughout my 27 seasons in the chair which in Stilly's time means his stints at Dagenham and Redbridge twice, Luton Town, Barnet twice and presently during his time at Southend United.

Expectation levels of our two clubs are in truth polar opposites. Southend United are the club that failed by a whisker at Wembley in the play off final last season, having seemingly had the game won or that's how it seemed when I was watching it. As such, after that very successful season, expectation this season is understandably huge, which means you must handle that type of pressure accordingly.

We, of course, have our own pressures and have quiet ambition but our pressure is very different to Southend's for very obvious reasons which doesn't include keeping happy an 8,000 average home crowd or an average 1,000 travelling cohort, which is truly amazing support for this level.

On reflection the pressure on me, possibly felt off the scale 18 months ago, when we were relegated but it lifted hugely just six months ago when we won promotion back to the National League via the play offs at the first attempt. All of which has meant that our expectations this season are more about continuing our good recruitment, continuing the building ambitions off the park and continuing to give our Manager Luke Garrard, and Sporting Director Charlie Hunter the tools and best budget I can to be competitive.

So this evening to be welcoming such a big club as Southend United once again is brilliant. It's also true that nights like tonight felt a million miles away just 12 months ago when, with respect, we would have welcomed say a Chippenham or an Aveley to Meadow Park which after the previous decade was hard to accept. That is now once again in the past and tonight we are in truth welcoming the biggest club in the South of England who are not playing in the EFL.

I'm sure for Southend United supporters it's not exactly an exciting prospect playing us in front of our 1,000 home fans but for me and our town it tells us just how far we've come over the last decade and trust me we also know that Southend United supporters deserve league football - and but for your previous owner you would never have been down at this level and we know with your fanbase you deserve so much better.

For me though it's more about worrying about us tonight and to sit third at present is testament to our bottom up approach to club business, it's testament to our small steps approach to building our stadium, and testament to our gradual budget increases over the last decade to move ourselves forward.

That type of patience is rare in football but is testament to you our loyal supporters, to my staff, to our gaffer, to our incredible work ethic, and is a thumbs up to your patience and our business model.

In truth the early indicators for our whole football club are looking pretty good on all fronts and they are far better than we could have possibly hoped for. So can I just say to everyone connected with the club including our partners, sponsors, supporters and dressing room, well done on our start, let's not go overboard as it's not how you start

a season it's how you finish, but let's enjoy this moment as it's well deserved.

To the Southend United fans can we simply say, you truly are an amazing group of supporters, whose loyalty, care and love for your club, always shine through and you've shown many times that without you your club would have gone bust many times.

In its many moments of need under Mr Ron Martin you rallied each other and you found a way to survive and continue your club's proud history. Trust me all at Boreham Wood FC wish you all the very best of luck in your quest to get yourselves back to the EFL, as NO set of supporters would deserve it more.

Lastly, whoever you support this evening, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.







Nathan RALPH Born: 14 Februry 1993 Position: Defender

Left-back Nathan Ralph began his career with Yeovil Town in 2012, scoring once in 17 appearances before leaving in 2015. Injuries hampered a spell at Newport County, followed by a productive stint at Woking, where he became a key player over two seasons. Moving to Dundee in 2018, he earned Player of the Year honours despite relegation. Ralph joined Southend United in 2019, scoring in the EFL Trophy, becoming captain, and signing multiple extensions to remain a defensive mainstay at Roots Hall.



Sam AUSTIN
Born: 19 December 1996
Position: Midfield

Sam Austin began his career with Burton Albion, debuting in the 2013 League Cup and making his League Two bow the following year. After a loan at AFC Telford United, he was released in 2016 and joined Kidderminster Harriers, where he became a versatile mainstay, moving from right-back to attacking roles. Austin earned a place in the 2021–22 National League North Team of the Season before signing for Notts County in 2022. In June, the dynamic midfielder signed with the Shrimpers on a three-year deal.



Andrew **DALLAS**

Born: 22 July 1999 Position: Forward

On loan at the Shrimpers from Barnsley, Scottish striker Andy Dallas began at Rangers' academy, debuting professionally on loan with Stenhousemuir, where he helped win promotion. After a spell at Greenock Morton, he moved to Cambridge United in 2019 and shone on loan at Weymouth, scoring 12 goals in 25 games. Dallas joined Solihull Moors in 2021, twice reaching the National League playoff final, including a five-goal haul in one match. Subsequent moves included Chesterfield, Barnsley and loans to Kilmarnock, Oldham, Barrow and Morecambe, where he continued to score consistently across England's lower leagues.

Last time at home against the Shrimpers, Wood produced a strong display but were held to a 1-1 thanks to a superb goalkeeping performance from Nick Hayes.



SOUTHEND UNITED

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war Southend United goalscoring favourites

ALBERT WAKEFIELD

Powerful centre-forward Albert Wakefield was Southend United's leading marksman in 1949-50. Signing professional for Leeds United in October 1942, he scored on his League debut to clinch their 2-1 victory at Southampton in August 1947 and topped their goalscoring charts in 1947-48. He joined Southend in an exchange deal involving Frank Dudley in August 1949 and partnered the likes of Cyril Grant and Les Stubbs. Starring in the 1951-52 FA Cup run, he netted 57 goals in 109 League games prior to joining Clacton in June 1953. Top scorer in 1953-54, he worked in the building trade and died in November 2006.

ROY HOLLIS

Tall centre-forward Roy Hollis holds
Southend United's goalscoring record.
Initially with Great Yarmouth, he joined
Norwich City in May 1947 and scored a
hat-trick on his League debut against QPR
in April 1948. He was leading marksman in
1951-52 and moved to Tottenham Hotspur in
December 1952. Harry Warren signed him in
February 1954 and he was top scorer in three
successive seasons, helping Southend beat
Liverpool in the 1956-57 FA Cup third round.
He netted 122 goals in 240 League outings
prior to joining Chelmsford City in March
1960, then ran a betting office and died in
Great Yarmouth in November 1998.

SAMMY McCRORY

Northern Ireland international inside-right Sammy McCrory played alongside Roy Hollis at Southend United. Starting with Linfield, he joined Swansea in October 1946 and starred in their 1948-49 Third Division (South) title triumph. He moved to Ipswich Town with Jim Feeney for £18,000 in March 1950, then Plymouth prior to joining Southend in June 1955. Ever-present in 1955-56, he helped beat Liverpool in the 1956-57 FA Cup third round, netting 90 times in 205 League outings before joining Cambridge United in July 1960. He became Crusaders' playerboss, then a publican in Belfast and died in May 2011.

BILLY BEST

Scottish striker Billy Best was Southend United's leading marksman three times. Starting with Pollok Juniors, he joined Northampton Town in July 1962 and featured in their meteoric rise to the top-flight. Ernie Shepherd signed him in January 1968 and he was a key figure in Southend's 1971-72 promotion success, netting 106 goals in 226 League outings before rejoining Northampton in September 1973. He starred in their 1975-76 promotion triumph, then played for Bedford Town and Corby Town. Later a self-employed painter and decorator in Northampton, he became a contracts manager for a roofing company.

BILL GARNER

Powerful striker Bill Garner was leading goalscorer in Southend United's 1971-72 promotion success. Signing professional for Notts County in July 1966, he had spells with Loughborough United, Dunstable and Bedford before moving to Roots Hall for £15,000 in November 1969. He netted 41 goals in 102 League outings for Southend prior to joining Chelsea for a record £100,000 in September 1972 after impressing against

them in a League Cup-tie. Successive injuries hindered his progress in the top-flight and he later played for Cambridge United, Brentford and Southend again. He became a local sports teacher.

DEREK SPENCE

Northern Ireland international striker Derek Spence was ever-present and leading marksman in Southend United's 1980-81 Fourth Division title triumph. Initially with Crusaders, he moved via Oldham Athletic to Bury in February 1973 and was top scorer in their 1973-74 promotion success. He followed Allan Brown to Blackpool in October 1976, rejoining the Seasiders after a spell with Olympiakos and moving to Southend in exchange for Colin Morris in December 1979. Scoring 32 goals in 104 League outings, he joined Hong Kong side See Bee in July 1982, then Bury again. He was Blackpool's community officer for 20 years.

DAVID CROWN

Striker David Crown was Southend United's leading goalscorer three times. He played for Grays Athletic, Walthamstow Avenue and Brentford prior to joining Portsmouth in October 1981 and featured in their 1982-83 Third Division title campaign. Moving to Reading in August 1983, he was a promotion winner in 1983-84 and joined Cambridge United in July 1985. Paul Clark signed him in November 1987 and he starred in Southend's 1989-90 promotion success, netting 61 goals in 113 League outings before joining Gillingham in June 1990, then played for Dagenham & Redbridge and Purfleet. He became an accountant.

BRETT ANGELL

Tall striker Brett Angell was Southend United's leading marksman in two consecutive seasons, including their 1990-91 promotion triumph. He started with his older brother Darren at Portsmouth and moved via Cheltenham Town to Derby County in February 1988. Joining Stockport County in October 1988, he was top scorer in 1989-90 and David Webb paid £100,000 for him in August 1990. He scored 47 goals in 115 League games for Southend before being sold to

Everton for £500,000 in January 1994, then played for Sunderland, Stockport again, Walsall, Notts County, Preston, Rushden & Diamonds and Port Vale.

FREDDY EASTWOOD

Welsh international striker Freddy Eastwood was top scorer as Southend United won promotion in two consecutive seasons. Starting with West Ham, he joined Grays Athletic in August 2003 and moved to Southend in October 2004, scoring a hat-trick on his League debut. Featuring in the 2005 LDV Vans Trophy final, he scored in that season's League Two play-off final triumph and was 'Player of the Year' as Southend won the League One title in 2005-06. He joined Wolves for £1,500,000 in July 2007 and moved via Coventry City back to Southend in March 2012, netting 64 goals in 179 League games overall

STAN COLLYMORE

Exciting striker Stan Collymore gained three England caps after leaving Southend United. He impressed with Stafford Rangers prior to joining Crystal Palace in December 1990 and moved to Roots Hall for £750,000 in November 1992. Scoring 15 goals in 30 First Division games for Southend, he was sold to Nottingham Forest for £3.750.000 in June 1993 and starred as they won promotion. then qualified for the UEFA Cup. He joined Liverpool for £8,500,000 in July 1995, then moved to Aston Villa for £7,000,000 in May 1997 and played for Leicester City, Bradford City and Real Oviedo before working in the media.
