***Today we welcome Truro City to the Mangata Developments Stadium Meadow Park, can I wish their Directors, Manager, Players, Staff and Supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.***

Well, after having no game on Saturday it's nice to report that the positivity and euphoria that I felt after the play-off final still resonates within me and I'm determined to enjoy this upbeat feeling for a little while longer and so I write my notes accordingly.

After deservedly beating Braintree Town here 2-1 on Wednesday night, we arrive for this afternoon's August Bank Holiday Monday game fresh, as we had no Saturday game as the York City away game was postponed as the Women's Rugby World Cup are using their facility, but why was the fixture not reversed?

To tell you the truth, after our promotion I was perhaps slightly cautious going into this new season as I felt our recruitment had stalled a tad in the last month and I knew our squad was still not quite ready. Those cautious thoughts though over the last few weeks have quietly been replaced with optimism as it's now clear after signing Luke Norris and Tom White, that our first few weeks back in the National League has shown we can once again compete at this level.

I'm now quietly confident that we can, if we stay patient, continue to put together a competitive squad with one eye on the future with one or two further additions, then I do feel we will be able to compete across the season as a whole in what is a demanding and unrelenting league.

So having gone from being a tad cautious just a few weeks ago, I now feel we have started the season reasonably well and believe much of that is because we have all worked tremendously hard as a club

over the last 12 months. We got our reward with our promotion and because we have continued to work even harder over this summer I believe if we continue in that vein then our determination to improve ourselves will again be rewarded as the season unfolds. The standards we continue to set in and around the club are there for all to see and while I'm here I hope those standards will continue to rise year on year.

Though there is still much to do, my focus out of necessity, will very soon turn away from first team matters and the day to day communications and meetings with the sporting director and manager to focus on next spring's South Stand build. I will miss being a small part of Luke and Charlie Hunter's recruitment think tank, but I must focus more on the South end of the Stadium and ensure the planning application submitted is well received.

Hopefully by early spring of next year we can mobilise in that area and begin the new supporter pathways, away fans zone including catering units, maintenance sheds, fencing, turnstiles, lighting, toilets, signage and forming the new away entrances at the South end of the Stadium.

If I can remain on schedule during phase 1, building wise, it would allow me to start in earnest the South Stand that will tick all EFL boxes and I genuinely hope to start phase 2 in late April or early May 2026 but I already know that is hugely optimistic on my part and perhaps too ambitious?

Having Ciara Dyer, Mande Morris, Luke Garrard, Charlie Hunter, Loretta Browne and Billy Hunter dealing with club and first

team matters, academy, administration and recruitment, means that our club is in safe hands and their work ethic will free me up to do what I do best in closing deals, furthering partnerships, cultivating relationships and hopefully creating future investment that can only help our clubs understated progress both on and off the pitch.

Only by having this group of very loyal, intelligent and talented people (many of whom have been with me for more than twenty years), does it allow me to get on with securing the required planning permissions, attend the meetings, tweak the designs, deal and satisfy officers, create additional funding or assistance from our partners, whilst also allowing time to search for further opportunities and sponsorships. If I can focus on that, it will allow us to create a legacy by cementing the hugely important long standing relationships with HBC, EBTC, AFC, AWFC, SCL and many of our other local partners and sponsors.

In truth while I feel so positive, now is possibly the right time for me and HBC and EBTC to push on with our vision and hopefully we can build something very special at the South end of the Stadium and within Meadow Park for the park users, for Brook Road car park users, for our local residents and of course for you our very loyal fans.

Now is the right time to push on and complete the stadium, now is the right time to future proof this club and the surrounding areas around Meadow Park and now is the right time to fund, finance, build and create long term legacy. It is now my intention to increase third party footfall within the town and look to increase home attendances and if I can also increase third party spend within our high streets then everyone wins. In truth any extra spend can only help our retail parks and retailers and by increasing our visitors footfall from outside the area, and if I can find one or two new partnerships along the way it will

help fuel my ambition to one day see us play in the EFL.

As you can see from my visuals aligned to these notes, I'm not holding back and I'm not looking at a non league type project or the cheap option. I'm looking at the most cost effective, realistic option, that would best suit our town, residents and club users.

If I succeed with the new build, my vision will also best deliver for our community partners and of course allows you our loyal supporters to dream big. I've always argued the merits of small steps and risk averse policies for more than 25 years and as you know I have always believed in partnerships, collaborations, in planning ahead and I can only do that with realistic investment and step by step improvements.

That has been my mantra moving forward for decades as it suits my mindset, it suits my business sensibilities and suits my business model and pocket. That said in my first 10 years here, my way of working was mostly met with cynicism, criticism, negativity, and what I thought was progressive back then was often met with rejection and some supporters even stopped coming to games because of it.

Thankfully as the successes and promotions followed and as the facility slowly improved the supporters who rejected my methods back then have mostly all came back and many are now very good friends of mine, so perhaps God really does loves a trier haha?

When I look back to 1999, I possibly tried way too hard to keep everyone happy and tried way too hard to rekindle a spirit in club that I was brought up in, in the late 60's and early 70's when my late father managed here. That was of course very naive of me, as I had remembered a child's eye view of the club and possibly not the reality of its existence upon my arrival here. The truth was I had walked into the

previous owners club, as an outsider in my own club and it was in a real mess. In truth the club I had remembered once had a soul but the club back in 1999 was nothing but a drinking house that had long been forgotten by our town, by our community save of course for few big FA Cup days.

So I found my first decade of ownership here pretty lonely, very costly, soul destroying and in more ways than one very, very difficult. However, after that first decade the last 17 seasons, other than the one relegation we suffered 16 months ago, our recent history has been full of upsides, incredible memories and full of promotions and that's my message for everyone today, let's enjoy the good times, as they are coupled with constant stadium improvements, facility upgrades and even our crowd averages have increased.

This club as a boy was perhaps in my bones but my care for the club and this town now is marrow deep and whenever I think of my father managing here, my head is full of local footballing memories both good and bad, but like most 'glass half full people', we only ever remember the good. When Dad managed here Bill O'Neil was the Chairman and the team was full of men, they won titles and cups and thankfully in my fathers memory, since I arrived here we've also won titles, cups, promotions and of course a few play offs. Let's be honest who amongst us doesn't love the play offs , just as long as you win them and we've won three of them during my time here.

Apart from the play offs, who doesn't love a bit of FA Cup success and in the time myself and Luke Garrard have been together we've created history for our football club and together we got to enjoy those incredible FA Cup successes by finally beating football league clubs. The first football league club we ever beat was Blackpool 2-1 here, then the floodgates seemed to open over the subsequent years as we went on to beat Wimbledon, Southend United, Bristol Rovers.

Perhaps though the most special of those memories was that historic Sunday Night, when as a town you turned out in your thousands to witness the upset of all upsets, as little Boreham Wood beat Bournemouth 1-0 away to set up a last 16 FA Cup tie with the 'Toffeemen' of Everton up at Goodison Park.

So I do not apologise for being in such good spirits as I reminisce before our Bank Holiday fixture against Truro, I'm in truth still feeling joyous and thankful for last seasons promotion and I want to keep this positive mindset over the coming months, as we once again look to the future and look ahead to the builds ahead while celebrating our very proud past.

Anyway, back to today, as we meet last season's National South Champions in Truro City and we congratulate them on their very well deserved title win. That said, this is a new season and as always with a new season, hope springs eternal.

Lastly, whoever you support let's hope for an open attacking game and may the best team win.



***Good afternoon, firstly I would like to welcome John Askey his Staff and Players to Mangata Developments Stadium for this afternoons National League fixture.***

I would like to congratulate John and Truro City, for a fantastic achievement last season in getting promoted, as champions of The National League South.

They are most definitely in safe hands with their manager, someone who has gained promotion throughout all three divisions and will know exactly what it looks like to compete within the League.

They have had a tough start facing two play-off teams from last year in both York City and Southend United in their first four matches, they will know them fixtures will not define them and will want to grow with confidence and belief to kick start their campaign.

We are hopeful to continue our current run of form, having won 2 and drawn 1 in our last three fixtures. The performance in large spells on Wednesday evening was very pleasing, we showed periods of control and possibly should have been better off with more goals.

Today we have to show our superpowers and play with a tempo and energy that has been ever present since our return to The National League.

Let's get right behind the players and continue to give them the confidence and belief to maintain our current form and get another huge 3points this Afternoon.

In between the sticks for the Tinners, Lavercombe joined the Cornwall side last year after a standout spell at Taunton Town, where he made 39 appearances and kept 12 clean sheets. A Torquay United academy graduate, he later signed for Wigan Athletic in 2016, enjoying loan spells back at Torquay and with Rhyl. After time with AFC Fylde and three impressive seasons at FC United of Manchester, he became ever-present in City's National League South title-winning campaign.



## Connor RILEY-LOWE

**Born:** 10 January 1996

**Position:** Defender

Skipper, Riley-Lowe began his career at Exeter City, making 14 appearances and enjoying loan spells with Truro before joining the Tinners permanently in 2017. Twice named Player of the Year, he moved to Bath City in 2019 but returned a year later. A key figure ever since, he earned back-to-back Player of the Year awards, scored the decisive play-off final winner in 2023, and captained John Askey's men to the National League South title.



## Luke JEPHCOTT

**Born:** 6 January 2000

**Position:** Forward

Cornwall-raised frontman Luke Jephcott came through Plymouth Argyle's academy, debuting in 2018/19 before a prolific loan spell with the Tinners. Recalled to Argyle, his goals powered their 2019/20 promotion, and he later hit double figures in League One while earning Wales U21 caps. After spells with Swindon, St Johnstone, and Newport, he rejoined Truro in February, making the move permanent this summer to continue his career with the Tinners.

# TRURO CITY

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten post-war Truro City goalscoring favourites

### VINCE DILLON

Centre-forward Vince Dillon had a spell as Truro City's player-manager. Signing professional for Bolton Wanderers in April 1948, he scored twice in their 3-0 win at home to Aston Villa in August 1948. He understudied England international Nat Lofthouse before moving to Tranmere Rovers in February 1951. Appointed Truro's player-manager in July 1953, he starred as they were South Western League runners-up in 1954-55. He spent the 1955-56 campaign as Falmouth's player-coach, then rejoined Truro and netted over 100 goals in total before joining St Dennis in July 1958. He resided in Truro until his death in September 2005.

### BASIL STEER

Striker Basil Steer was Truro City's leading marksman in three successive seasons. Starting at West Alvington, playing alongside his brothers Ray and Terry, he then had spells with Tavistock and St Blazey before joining Truro in July 1958. He scored in their 1959 Cornwall Senior Cup final replay triumph and helped win the South Western League Cup the following season. Ever-present top scorer with 43 goals as Truro won the South Western League title for the first time in 1960-61, he suffered from asthma but netted 17 hat-tricks and 154 goals overall. He represented both Devon and Cornwall at football and cricket and died in February 2000.

### NEIL IMRIE

Scottish striker Neil Imrie had three spells at Truro City. 'Jock' was in the Royal Navy and played for several teams in the Plymouth area. He had a brief period at Falmouth Town after finishing his naval service before

joining Truro in July 1964. Helping win the Cornwall Charity Cup in 1964-65, then both the Cornwall Senior Cup and South Western League Cup in 1966-67, he was leading marksman in his first four seasons at the club. He returned each time from spells at Porthleven and St Blazey, becoming Truro's player-manager in 1972-73 and netting over 170 goals overall for the Tinnerns. Settling back in his native Dundee, he died in January 2022.

### COLIN CHEGWYN

Winger Colin Chegwyn was a key figure as Truro City achieved the South Western League title and Cornwall Senior Cup 'double' in 1969-70. He began with Camelford and joined Truro in December 1964, scoring in their 1965 Cornwall Charity Cup final success. Starring as Truro won both the Cornwall Senior Cup and South Western League Cup in 1966-67, he scored in every round of the 1969-70 Cornwall Senior Cup. He netted nine hat-tricks for Truro and 117 goals overall. Moving to Falmouth Town in July 1970, he starred as they won both the South Western League title, then Western League title in four successive seasons before joining Liskeard.

### JOHNNY WARDLE

Striker Johnny Wardle starred in Truro City's 1969-70 South Western League title and Cornwall Senior Cup 'double' success. Born in Plymouth, he played for Trelawny, Saltash United and Barnstaple Town, then helped Torpoint Athletic win the South Western League title for the second time in three seasons before joining Truro in October 1966. Scoring twice on his debut in a 6-0 victory at Nanpean, he featured prominently as the Tinnerns won both the Cornwall Senior

Cup and South Western League Cup in 1966-67. He netted 92 goals overall prior to joining Newquay in July 1973 for a season and worked for the electrical department at Devonport Dockyard.

### **STEVE WHERRY**

Striker Steve Wherry was an important figure in Truro City's 1992-93 South Western League and Cup 'double' triumph. A former Bristol City apprentice, he also played for Illogan RBL, hometown Redruth and Penryn Athletic prior to joining Truro in November 1991. He was leading marksman five times, also starring as they won the South Western League title in again in 1995-96 and 1997-98. Helping win the Cornwall Senior Cup in 1995, he scored in their 1998 Cornwall Senior Cup final replay success. He later became player/assistant-boss alongside Graeme Kirkup and netted 17 hat-tricks for the Tinnars, scoring a then club record 217 goals.

### **DAMIAN STEVENS**

Striker Damian Stevens featured prominently as Truro City achieved the South Western League title and Cornwall Senior Cup 'double' in 1997-98. Born locally, he made his debut in Truro's 3-3 draw at Appledore in August 1991 and grabbed a hat-trick in their 8-0 win at home to Bugle a week later. 'Damo' helped the Tinnars reach the Cornwall Senior Cup final in 1994-95, the first time in 25 years, but missed the final triumph. Starring as Truro won the South Western League title in 1995-96, he had a spell as captain and was leading marksman in 2000-01. He netted 100 goals overall prior to joining Falmouth Town in July 2001, becoming their manager.

### **ANDY WATKINS**

Striker Andy Watkins featured in Truro City's 2007 FA Vase final triumph. Previously at Launceston, St Blazey, Plymouth Argyle, Bodmin Town and Bideford, he joined Truro in July 2006 and starred as they won the Western League First Division title and Cornwall Senior Cup in 2006-07. He also featured as they went on to win the Western League Premier Division title and Cornwall Senior Cup in 2007-08, Southern League First Division South & West title in 2008-09 and Southern League Premier Division title in 2010-11. Twice leading marksman, he netted 120 goals in 142 games, moving to Bath City in

July 2013, then Tiverton and Mousehole.

### **STEWART YETTON**

Striker Stewart Yetton holds Truro City's all-time goalscoring record. Initially with hometown Plymouth Argyle, he had a loan spell at Weymouth and moved via Tiverton Town to Truro in October 2005. He starred as they achieved a British record five promotions in six seasons, soaring from the Western League First Division to Conference South. Top scorer four times, netting 20 hat-tricks, 'Yetti' also helped Truro win the FA Vase in 2007 and played at Charlton Athletic in the 2007-08 FA Cup first round. He featured in three Cornwall Senior Cup final triumphs, scoring 232 goals in 356 games during three spells at Truro and becoming assistant-boss.

### **TYLER HARVEY**

Striker Tyler Harvey was top scorer and 'Player of the Year' in Truro City's 2024-25 Conference South title triumph. Starting with hometown Plymouth Argyle, he had spells at Salisbury and Bath City prior to joining Wrexham in July 2016. He moved to Truro in January 2017 and scored in their 2017-18 FA Cup first round defeat at Charlton Athletic. Rejoining Bath City in June 2019, he returned to Truro just two months later and starred in their 2022-23 promotion success. He has been top scorer in each of the past five completed seasons plus those aborted by the coronavirus pandemic, netting 162 goals in 286 games by the end of last season.
